DRSS	<p>Test: Tr-4th: Short conservative color coat w/tie, choker or stock tie, white or light colored breeches or jodhpurs, boots or jodhpur boots, hunt cap or riding hat w/hard shell, derby or top hat. Cutaway coat w/short tails permitted. Half-chaps, gaiters & leggings not allowed. Conservative color gloves recommended. Protective headgear may be worn w/short dark jacket, dark hatcover (where applicable) or Armed Services or police uniform (if eligible) & otherwise conforming as above. Members of Armed Services/police may ride in their service uniform at any level. Riders wearing Armed Services or police uniform must wear the appropriate military/police cap/hat for their branch of service, or protective headgear. (DR120.1-4) Pas de Deux/Quadrille: Must follow USDF Requirements ex. headgear & boots required as in DR120.1-4. Warmup: Boots/shoes must have a distinguishable heel. FEI Jr & 4/5/6 yo Tests: Conserv. color short jacket, stock or tie, breeches, hunt cap or riding hat w/hard shell, derby or top hat & spurs optional. Pony Riders: Dark coat or club uniform coat, breeches or jodhpurs, white shirt w/tie or stock, gloves, boots & hunt cap; top hat or bowler forbidden. CDIs 1* & CDIs 2*: Same or black or dark blue jacket (see above) w/bowler, hunt cap or approved protective headgear. This dress also desirable for all other internat. events unless otherwise stated in rules. (National colors may only be used on collars of jackets & must be registered w/FEI. Military (includ. students & employees), police, national studs/ schools/ institutes, etc.: Same or civil or service dress. Earphones prohib. while competing but permitted in warmup. (Art. 427)</p>	<p>Test: Beg. Novice-Prelim HTs: Black or dark blue hunt cap; dark or tweed coat (tails not permitted); white or light color shirt w/stock & pin, choker or tie; light or white jodhpurs or britches; black or brown field or jodhpur boots or a black or brown full grain smooth leather leg piece and matching leather boots. Optional: dark, tan, beige or white gloves. Chaps &/or half-chaps not allowed. HTs (Intermed-Advan), 2 -days & 3-days: Same ex. no tweed coat & tails allowed w/black or dark blue top hat, shirt, stock w/pin, white or dark gloves req., pref. black dress boots or black full grain leather leg piece and matching leather boot. SADY	<p>Test: *English saddle w/stirrups req. for USEF & USDF tests. *May be constructed w/w/o tree but cannot have D horn, swell gallerie, or open gullet. Australian, Baroque, D Endurance, McClellan, Spanish, Stock, or Western L saddles (or modified versions) not permitted ex. E w/USEF Disp. Certif. Tr-2nd: Snaffle w/ cavesson (not too tightly fixed), dropped, flash, crescent or crossed noseband. Noseband must be all leather or leather-like ex. for buckles, crescent & small sheepskin disk on crossed noseband. Padded noseband & chinpad w/cavesson allowed. BTSS	<p>Pictured in USEF Rule Book: Mouthpiece must be metal or rigid plastic but may be made w/rubber, plastic or leather cover; & may not be modified by adding latex, etc. Synthetic or flexible mouthpiece bits (incl. flex. rubber or synthetic) permitted, provided contours conform to a pictured bit. All must be smooth w/ solid surface; no twisted, wire or roller bits. A bushing or coupling is permit. as center link in dbl jointed snaffle ex. surface of centerpiece must be solid w/no moveable parts; mouthpiece of snaffle may be shaped in sl. curve; ported snaffles prohib. Type of bit may not vary, must be attached only as pictured. Any bit combining any mouthpiece pictured in Fig.1A w/any cheek piece in 1A is permitted. NAYRC & MAJC) unless otherwise prohib. by USEF or FEI rules or class selection procedures. Warmup: One lungeing whip only when lungeing & one whip not over 43.3" (incl. lash) permitted. Adjustable length whip prohib. while mounted. (DR120.5 & 121.9) Optional for Equitation. (DR132).</p>	<p>Same as Tr-4th Levels, plus no whip in (1) USEF/ USDF Champs; (2) USEF HP Champs, Qual. & Select. Trials & Observ. classes; (3) USEF National Dres. Champs. (DR120.5 & 121.9). Metal spurs w/round, hard plastic knobs on shank are allowed ("Impuls" spur). "Dummy" spurs w/no shank permitted. Restriction also applies to warmup & training areas. Each bit must be attach. to a separate rein. Reins may only be attach. to bits. Decoration of horse forbid. ex. braiding of mane & tail. False tails w/o metal parts permit. Discreet fly hoods not covering eyes permitted only in extreme cases at discretion of judge(s). Warmup: Same ex. ear muffs, run. martingales (only w/snaffle & connect. to rein on same side & free to slide; the rings through which reins slide may not be connected to a neck strap), boots, bandages (w/o magnets) & single direct side reins (attached from bit to girth, saddle or surcingle on side of horse (not bet. legs) & used only when lungeing mounted or unmounted) are permitted. However, the Ground Jury is permitted to make decisions in all circumstances not specifically addressed by the rules.
